**Edward Ko-ling Chan, PhD**, obtained his doctoral degree and joined the faculty of the University of Hong Kong in 2000. Dr. Chan is specialized in the research and practice with family violence. He has conducted researches including the impact of family violence on battered women and their children, prevalence and risk factors of spousal violence, narrative accounts of male batterers, pregnancy and violence in Mainland China, debt and suicide, international dating violence study etc. He has developed an indigenous model of explaining Chinese men who batter their wives. Dr. Chan has been actively practicing therapeutic groups and counseling on men with sex and relationship problems. He has contribution in developing Parallel Group Model for parenting, battered women and their children, and young couples on sex and birth plan.

He had completed a research project commissioned by the Hong Kong Government to study the prevalence rates and the risk factors of spousal and child abuse in Hong Kong, to review the legislative measures and to validate the risk assessment tool. He and his colleagues had also completed the first territory-wide study of Intimate Partner Violence against Pregnant Women in 7 Obstetrics & Gynaecology Units in 6 clusters of the Hospital Authority. He is currently directing a study of the domestic violence costs and service utilization in Hong Kong, funded by the Research Grants Council, as well as a national study on child sexual abuse in China, funded by UBS Optimus Foundation. Dr. Chan is active in the research and teaching in Hong Kong and the Mainland China as well with the mission to help develop social work profession in Mainland China.
