



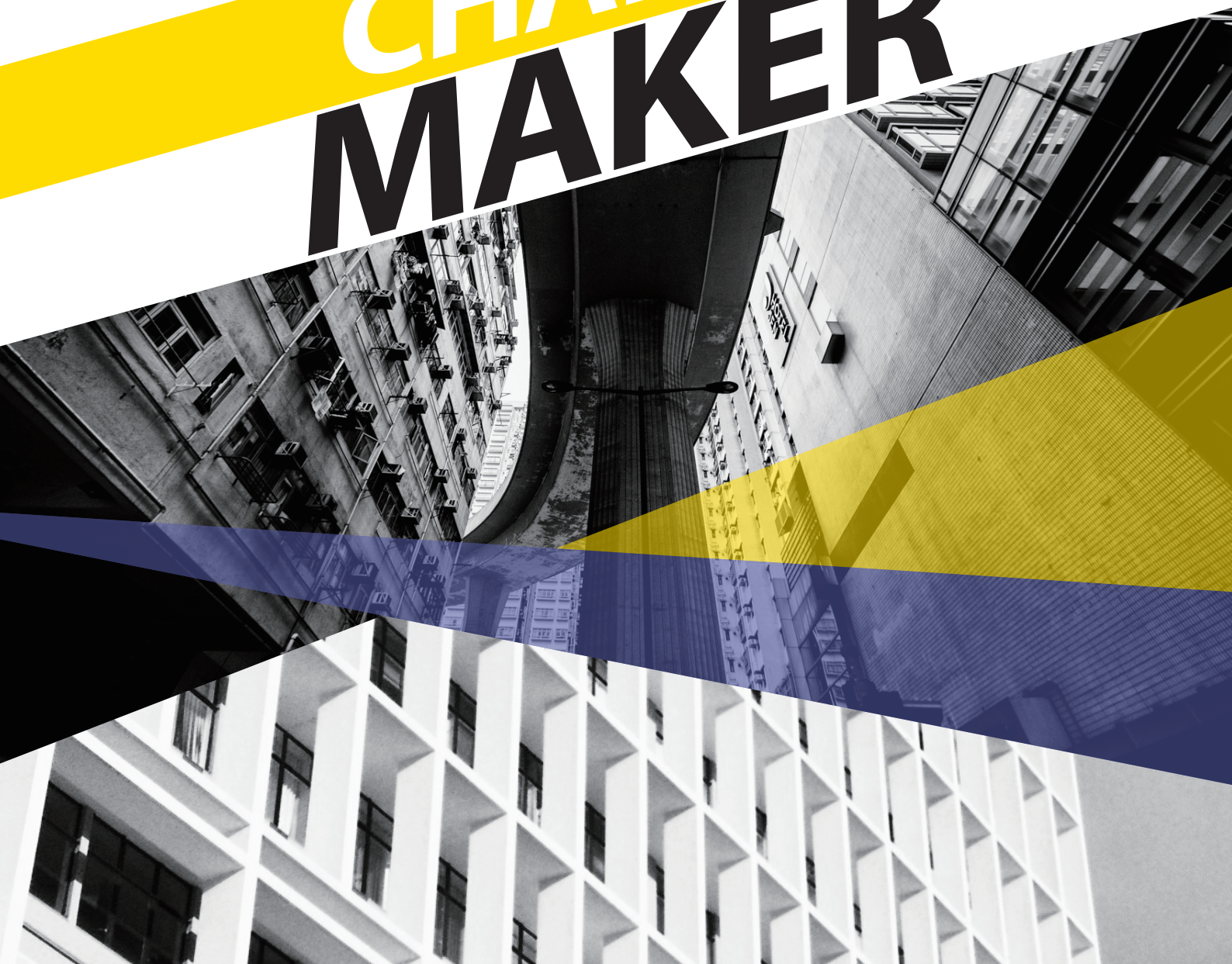

GLOBAL DEFINITION OF SOCIAL WORK

Social work is a practice-based profession and an academic discipline that promotes social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment and liberation of people. Principles of social justice, human rights, collective responsibility and respect for diversities are central to social work. Underpinned by theories of social work, social sciences, humanities and indigenous knowledge, social work engages people and structures to address life challenges and enhance wellbeing. The above definition may be amplified at national and/or regional levels.

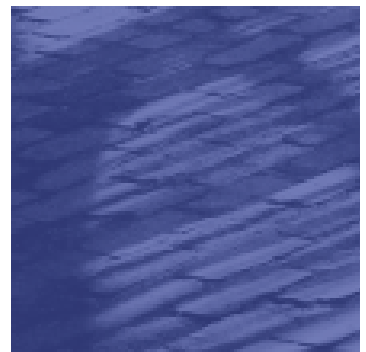


INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE

Social Work students can undertake half year-exchange opportunities in the second year without extending their studies.

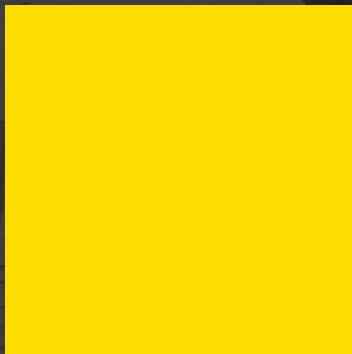
Over 20% of BSW students joined an exchange programme in past 3 years.

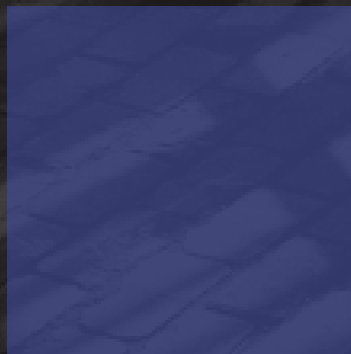
OVERSEAS PLACEMENT

SUPPORT AND RESOURCES

ACADEMIC ADVISING

- To assist students' adjustment to university life academically and socially,
- a Faculty Academic Adviser from the home Faculty is assigned upon admission to HKU;
- a Personal Tutor from the home Department is assigned each year from the second year of study onwards.

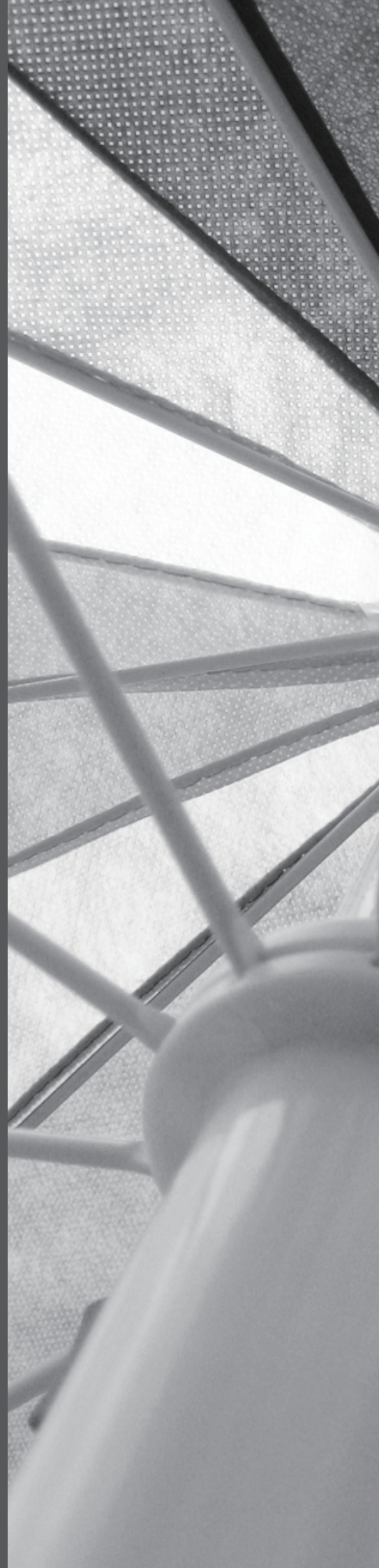

JUAPS APPLICANTS

- Minimum Programme Entrance Requirements:
English Language: Level 3
Chinese Language: Level 3
Mathematics: Level 2
Liberal Studies: Level 2
Elective Subjects: Level 3 in two subjects
- Any best 5 HKDSE subjects among Category A (excluding Mathematics Extended Modules 1 and 2) or Category C will be counted.
- Other Tie-breakers:
Credits in 5 and 5***
Heavier weighing in Mathematics and English
Interview score
Other learning experiences (OLE)
- Applicants are usually invited to interview once from May to June.
