### **RESEARCH GRANTS / PROGRAMS** (selected)

The total amount of research grants for projects which I have led, or actively participated in since 1985 after I worked at West China Hospital, Sichuan University approximates HK\$28.07 million. This includes US\$823,123 from peer-reviewed, competitive research grants in *World Health Organization* (WHO, PI, US\$15,000 and Co-I, US\$10,000), *National Institute of Health* (NIH, USA, PI, US\$250,000), *National Institute of Mental Health* (NIMH, USA, Co-PI, US\$33,500), *General Research Fund* (GRF, HK, PI, HK\$611,650), *American Foundation of Suicide Prevention* (AFSP, USA, PI, US\$60,000), *China Medical Board* (CMB, USA, Co-I, US\$335,000), and *National Natural Science Foundation of China* (NSFC, China, Co-I, CNY160,000). The GRF, NIH, NIMH and NSFC, as well as the AFSP, and CMB grants are extremely competitive, and the WHO grant is not only highly competitive but only given to people whose work will improve lives worldwide.

**(1) Chengdu Mental Health Project (CMHP):** Being founder and principal investigator, Dr. Ran set up the Chengdu Mental Health Project (CMHP), a unique, ongoing, longitudinal mental health project with a large population sample (about 150,000 people) in the world and a mental health research platform in China (1994-present). The CMHP includes a series of sub-research programs on various research areas, such as social development and mental health, health policy, community mental health, family intervention, stigma, suicide, etc. A systematic longitudinal database on mental illness and mental health services has been established.
